Food Pantry Report for September 2023 Newsletter

A total of 161 clients were served in July 2023, which meant 46 families were helped. So far since January 1, 2023, we have served 987 clients which means 310 families have been helped. We could not have accomplished this

without the support of our congregation and the dedicated volunteers who work at the Food Pantry.

Between January 26,2023, and July 25, 4857.7 pounds of food was donated for the Food Pantry from members of the congregation, as well as outside donors from the community. During the month of July, we received 505.6 pounds of food . We are very grateful for these donations.

During the upcoming Simply Giving campaign for St. Paul's Food Pantry at Meijer's on Lake Lansing Road, the Double Match Day opportunity will be held on Saturday, September 9,2023. For every \$10 Simply Give card purchased on these dates, Meijer will provide an additional contribution of \$20.00, bringing the total to \$30.00 for a single customer purchase. We received word from Meijer's that the 2023 Spring *Simply Give* campaign was a success for raising donations for families in the Midwest. St. Paul Food Pantry received \$7,000. The total

amount includes generous contributions made by congregation members, local Meijer customers, their vendor partners, and Meijer's corporate donations. A large part of the donations came from the LPGA Classic donations.

The Food Pantry Garden has been producing an abundance of produce in the past few weeks, especially tomatoes Thank you to all of those who have volunteered, including keeping it watered during the hot, dry days we have had. We also continue to receive donations from members' gardens, as well as a neighbor who has donated from her garden each week. The clients love fresh produce and we have arranged to take leftover produce and share it with MSU's Friendship House.

Volunteers are always appreciated who are able to work on Wednesday evenings and Thursday afternoon pantry distribution days. If you are available and would like to help, please contact Bev Johnson or Tracy Collins.

Register now for Adult Theological Education: Luther's Small Catechism

When Luther wrote that familiar question, "What does this mean?" he meant it! He wanted Christians to understand their faith and to see how God was at work in their lives, in the church, and in the world. Join the Rev. Dr. Kit Kleinhans, Dean of Trinity Lutheran Seminary at Capital University, for a six-week study of Luther's catechisms. Let's dig deep into what God means *for us*!

Before she was Dean at Trinity Lutheran Seminary, Dr. Kleinhans taught religion, including Lutheran Confessions and History of Christianity, at Wartburg College for 25 years. A fifthgeneration Lutheran pastor and a brilliant theologian and Luther scholar, Dr. Kleinhans cares about her students, the Church, and what it means to be Lutheran today. She has a pastor's heart and is capable of both the deeply esoteric and the foundationally concrete.

The class will meet on six consecutive Tuesday evenings: October 24, 31, November 7, 14, 21, 28 from 7:00 – 8:15pm ET. This course is open to all adults, both laypeople and rostered ministers, and is free of charge. Sessions will be recorded and available to registered participants. **Registration is required and will close on October 19, 2023.**



"God's work. Our hands" Sunday on September 10th this year and is a day that is an opportunity to celebrate who we are as the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America – one church, as each we serves their communities in a unique way. This year our Church Council has approved putting together Homeless Care Kits that actually help, which will be distributed by Advent House, which has people on the streets serving the homeless in Clinton, Eaton, Ingham and counties.
