Food Pantry Report for September 2023 Newsletter

Food Pantry Report for October 2023 Newsletter A total of 150 clients were served in August 2023, which meant 45 families were helped. So far since January 1, 2023, we have served 1137 clients which means 355 families have been helped. We could not have

accomplished this without the support of our congregation and the dedicated volunteers who work at the Food Pantry.

Between January 26,2023, and August 25, 5377.15 pounds of food was donated for the Food Pantry from members of the congregation, as well as outside donors from the community. During the month of August, we received 520.8 pounds of food . We are very grateful for these donations.

The Food Pantry Garden has continued producing an abundance of produce in the past few weeks. Thank you to all the garden volunteers and members of the congregation who have donated from their gardens this summer. The clients love the fresh produce.

The Food Pantry is seeking volunteers who might be able to assist on the 3rd Monday morning of each month to unload the Food Bank Delivery from Greater Lansing Food Bank. We generally meet around 8:30 a.m. and are finished by 10:00 a.m., depending on the number of volunteers that we have.

We are also continuing to seek volunteers who could work at pantry distribution on Wednesday evenings and on Thursday afternoon pantry days, as several of our current volunteers are unable to work at the current time. Anyone who is interested in helping can contact Bev Johnson or Tracy Collins. .
