We will see the accuracy of these predictions. Regardless, it's that time of year again. The end of October was Reformation Sunday. When Martin Luther read Roman 1:17 17 For in it the righteousness of God is revealed through faith for faith, as it is written, "The one who is righteous will live by faith." his torment ended as he realized the righteousness that God in his grace was making available to those who would receive it passively, not those who would achieve it actively, but that would receive it by faith, and by which a person could be reconciled to a holy and righteous God. This led to the Reformation.

Thank you Jon K. and Mary M. for leading these sessions. October 10th was commitment Sunday and most commitments were received. The first analysis is positive and Chuck N. will have more to say about this at the Annual meeting when the budget is presented. Thank you, Chuck, for coordinating this and doing the Temple Talk at worship. We resumed the Red Cross Blood Drive on October 20th and will continue this moving forward. Thanks to Jim C. for coordinating this. MSU musicians will have a concert at 11:45am on Sunday November 5th with Elene K. coordinating and performing. There is a free will offering for this concert. We will have a potluck after worship that day to precede the concert.

We are still looking for volunteers for the food pantry to unload the truck one Monday a month and either Wednesday or Thursday to distribute the food. Food Pantry Report for November 2023 Newsletter

A total of 178 clients were served in September 2023, which meant 51 families were helped. So far since January 1, 2023, we have served 1315 clients which means 406 families have been helped. We could not have accomplished this without the support of our congregation and the

dedicated volunteers who work at the Food Pantry.

Between January 26,2023, and September 25, 5658.3 pounds of food was donated for the Food Pantry from members of the congregation, as well as outside donors from the community. During the month of September, we received 380.4 pounds of food . We are very grateful for these donations.

The garden has been cleared out until next spring. Thank you to all the garden volunteers and members of the congregation who have donated from their gardens this summer. The clients loved the fresh produce.

The Food Pantry is currently seeking volunteers who might be able to assist on the 3rd Monday morning of each month to unload the Food Bank Delivery. We generally meet around 8:30-8:45a.m. and are finished by 10:00 a.m., depending on the number of volunteers that we have. We are also looking for volunteers who could work at pantry distribution on the 1st and 3rd Wednesday evenings of the month or the 2nd and 4th Thursday afternoons.
